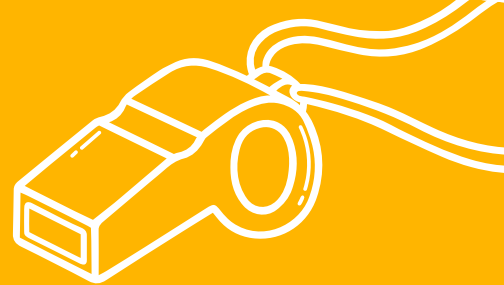
MYTH #1 COACHING IS A MALE WORLD REALITY
